NAEF to Seat Inaugural Board

Hello Nebraska School Foundation Leaders! I am so excited to share with you that the National Association of Education

seating a full board of directors.

Foundations (NAEF) is now ready to lean into our next move... Since April 2021, we have been working with attorneys to file the appropriate paperwork and build the infrastructure for a full functioning membership association. Our previous tax status under the National School Foundation Association (NSFA) limited us as a public charity. We had to be careful with training, membership

benefits, advocacy, and the development of certification programs. All of these items fit better under a professional development organization, or a 501c6, instead of a 501c3.

We knew that we wanted to bring our beloved Certified Education Foundation Leader (CEFL) program under our umbrella rather than relying on an outside institution to deliver the infrastructure for our program. To this end, we boldly made the leap and organized the NAEF. We have now made enough progress with the association's founding documents and paperwork that we are ready to seat a full board of directors. We plan to seat 10 education foundation leaders from around the country to lift this new organization to its potential. This board will be seated in January and have their first strategic planning session in late March. There will be some communication coming from the NAEF inviting education foundation leaders around the country to apply/declare their interest

to be on the board. We are looking for a diverse board of leaders who represent all kinds of education foundations. We want to give voice to various perspectives to really become a member driven organization. Once a board is seated, we will be on our way to the development of committees made up of even more members from around the country who will be able to both inform and contribute to our work. I hope that my Nebraska colleagues will consider a role with the NAEF. **Nebraska Strong**
