I don't know about you, but I find myself again saying or thinking that we just can't do another year like that one. Sounded familiar. It's been two years of anything but expected in our worlds. Here's what I've learned about the importance of our work in the last 2 years.



- Generosity: Our communities care. They trust our schools to do what it takes to keep kids safe and inspired. When we put a call out for help, they respond and they are grateful for the opportunity to put just a little bit of stability into what feels like a very unstable world.
- Partnership: With all the efforts for stabilizing families happening in our communities, it became critical to get to know the partners who were best at serving each need. The collaborations that happened between unlikely partners was exciting. New friendships based in a common cause flourished and continue past the emergencies.
- Efficiency: How many times did you say, "Before the pandemic we used to" and now we have learned that we can do it better, faster, smarter. I have heard and seen the non-profit industry and large systems learn how to embrace ambiguity and lean into new ways to communicate, validate and support. There were some real magical moments that have provided valuable lessons.
- Humility: Countless donors and professional colleagues have met my dog, seen my kitchen or heard my children during zoom meetings. We worried about our acquaintances health, checked in on those who lived alone. We all became more human. All too vulnerable and real. I think it improved our relationships and furthered our causes.
- Leadership: I learned that teams of people, when trusted to solve difficult problems, can dig deep and lead from where they sit. My staff took on way more than they signed up for. As a result we now each have a new perspective on our work.
- Purpose: I've never felt such urgency to build my organization to be stronger, healthier and more impactful. There is so much we can do to convene our communities to make sure that EVERY student has what they need to be successful. School foundations are underutilized as change makers in our communities and the pandemic taught us how to be better. We looked at data, community need, child wellbeing markers and we worked together to solve significant problems. We did that. And now it is up to us as leaders to take the innovative ideas that were born from necessity and sustain them for future generations.

So here's to 2022! May it teach us all that we need to learn, and may we weather its challenges with grace and humility. I'm just glad I get to weather it with my trusted friends and colleagues.

Keynote Speaker, John King

John B. King Jr. is a lifelong educator and a former secretary of education under President Obama. He lives in Silver Spring, Maryland, with his wife (a former kindergarten and first-grade teacher) and his two daughters, who attend Montgomery County Public Schools. King's family has deep roots in Maryland. His

great-grandfather, Charles King, was enslaved just 25 miles from his home in Montgomery County – and the cabin where his ancestors lived still stands. His grandmother, Estelle Livingston Stansberry King, attended the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (then called Princess Anne Academy), where she was among the first Black graduates in 1894.


