I can now confidently say that to have success as an Education Foundation Director, it is critical to have support from your Foundation Board, the School Board, School Administration and District Staff. I am fortunate that I have had an outpouring of support since the first day I stepped into my office (another consideration that should be thought through when bringing on a Director). There are often "tools" that need to be purchased to assist the Director in being successful: accounting software, a service like Grant Station, maybe a donor tracking software, marketing materials to use when meeting with hopeful Donors, and the list goes on.

With all of that said, one of the most important support systems that I have is my peer Foundation Directors. I'm always relieved to find that no question is a dumb question and thrilled with how supportive and quick to respond my fellow Directors always are. My advice to any Education

Foundation thinking about hiring a Director? Reach out to other Directors for guidance and assistance. They are your most valuable resource! Though this is my maiden run, I now know that some days are a furlong and others are a marathon. Some days an Education Foundation Director may feel like they want to spit the bit, but we know the next day we will be determined to hop up in the saddle, put our feet in the irons, and focus on a good workout.
