The Thank a Teacher Campaign is a fundraising campaign that allows our parents and members of the community to direct a gift to a specific classroom teacher in our district. We promote the campaign from August 1 – September 30 and with the help of campaign sponsors, ensure every teacher in the district receives at minimum a \$25 certificate to redeem. The first week of October,

and personally thank every teacher in the district for their commitment to our students.

Some of the teachers received over \$600 when generous parents found that their employers would match their gift. Teachers at schools with far less parent support were touched that they received gifts even though their parent participation was nothing. The teachers aren't expected to complete a grant application, or volunteer for their certificate. They simply indicate how they want to redeem it. They can be reimbursed for classroom purchases, request a gift card to make classroom purchases, order items through the foundation,

All of the teachers received the deep gratitude of our board and community for the impact they




