At Wayne Community Schools, 83% of the revenue the district generates to support a \$12 million-dollar general fund budget is collected through local tax receipts. Our district, like most rural districts in Nebraska, receives no equalization funding from the state aid formula. School Foundations play a very important role in partnering with school districts to support initiatives that go beyond regular general fund expenditures. A positive partnership and relationship a school district has with the school foundation is critical to the success of both the school district and school foundation. The Wayne Community Schools Foundation has been in existence since the 1980's. Beginning in 2012, the school district committed funds to establish the first paid executive director of the foundation on a three-year probationary status. The Wayne Community Schools Board of Education committed the funds to support the position because they understood the importance of the support a school foundation can provide to enhance educational opportunities for the students. As the position evolved, the foundation board has been

able to include the executive director position in operating costs, with a \$20,000 fee from the school district. A very valuable component to the success of this endeavor is the relationship between the school district superintendent, and the foundation executive director and board. Some ideas for school administrators and foundation directors that can nurture and enhance that relationship are listed below. • The superintendent serves as a non-voting member of the foundation board and attends all meetings. The executive director of the school foundation attends all meetings of the school

- board, and provides monthly updates.
- . The executive director serves on the school district management team, and is part of all meetings on a regular basis.

- The superintendent and foundation director work closely to plan activities that support the mission of the foundation and school district.

The relationship between the school district and school foundation are maintained and nurtured

by the superintendent and executive director. It is critical that both understand their role in supporting the work of the school board and foundation board. Having a positive relationship provides support that is seamless and benefits the students at Wayne Community Schools.


