Nebraska Legislative Bill 364

all to become familiar with Nebraska Legislative Bill 364 and utilize

your influence with your state senator against its passage. If you don't know them, NOW is the time to change that. The Nebraska Association of Public School Foundation's board of directors sent a letter to sponsors of the bill explaining why this bill is detrimental to public school education support. We find ourselves in a particularly interesting moment in our state's history where State Leadership is advocating for private school "scholarships" over Nebraska constitutionally guaranteed quality public school education. As we ALL know, despite what is coming from supporters of LB 364, public school education IS NOT fully funded and the TEEOSA formula is incredibly complex, not in any way transparent, and misunderstood by most

Nebraskans. The actual formula is: Needs - Resources = Equalization Aid but it has been amended numerous times since its inception and its first priority is property tax relief, followed by equalization of assistance for public education. I encourage you to learn more here. I also ask that you familiarize yourself with the potential impacts of <u>LB 364</u>. Click <u>here</u> to register public comments on the bill. The heart of LB 364 sets aside funding in the general budget needed for public school education and gives it to private schools while promising tax benefits. This not only hurts public school

funding, but it ALSO hurts our fundraising as non-profits. The playing field is in no way level and Nebraskans are being misled. While in our positions as K-12 Ed Foundation Leaders we may not

do a great deal of advocacy on legislative initiatives, please don't let this opportunity pass without your voice against the effort being heard. This is a bad bill for Nebraska and it is our duty to work with our elected officials to see it stopped. Thank you for your tireless efforts for the public school students of our great state! Please....make....your....voice....heard.... now! The students of our public school districts deserve better!
